TEAM INFORMATION

Aspire Teams - Skaters in Basic 4 LTS classes and up. There are multiple levels from basic skills through free skate levels. Aspire teams will have practice one day per week.

Preliminary - age 13 & younger and must have the Preliminary Skating Skills test passed. The Preliminary team will have practice twice a week.

Pre-Juvenile - age 17 & younger and must have the Pre-Juvenile Skating Skills test passed. The Pre-Juvenile team will have practice twice a week.

Open Juvenile - age 19 & younger. The Open Juvenile team will have practice 2-3 times per week.

Intermediate - age 19 & younger and must have the Intermediate Skating Skills test passed. The Intermediate team will have practice three times per week.

Adult - age 18 & older and must have passed either Preliminary Skating Skills, figures or dance. The Adult team will have practice one day per week.

GROUP 1

Group 1 - Skaters who are in Learn to Skate classes or were on Aspire 1 or Aspire 2 last season.

Clinics - March 13, March 20 - 5:30-6:30pm Tryouts - March 27 - 5:30-6:30pm





GROUP 2

Group 2 - Skaters who have passed Pre-Preliminary Skating Skills or skaters who were on Aspire 3 and Aspire 4 last season.

Clinics - March 13, March 20 - 6:30-7:30pm Tryouts - March 27 - 6:30-7:30pm

GROUP 3

Group 3 - Skaters who have passed Preliminary Skating Skills or higher or were on Preliminary, Pre-Juvenile or Open Juvenile last season

Clinics - March 13, March 20 - 7:45-8:45pm Tryouts - March 27 - 7:45-8:45pm





GROUP 4

Group 4 - Skaters who have passed Intermediate Skating Skills or were on Intermediate last season.

Clinics - March 12, March 19 - 5:30-7:30pm Tryouts - March 26 - 5:30-7:30pm

Can I watch tryouts?

Tryouts are closed to all spectators to allow skaters to fully concentrate and perform at their best without the distraction of an audience. Parents/guardians are welcome to stay in the lobby or concession stand area. Clinics are open to watch from the bleachers.

What should my skater wear to clinics and tryouts?

Please wear black pants, black tank top and jacket or long sleeve shirt that is form fitting. Please do not wear jeans or anything baggy. Girls should have their hair in a neat bun. Current Ice Storm skaters should wear their practice attire.

What if I cannot attend tryouts?

Make-up tryouts will be held on Tuesday, April 1st from 7:30-8:30pm. Please email Coach Lana to arrange a make-up tryout.

How do I know if I make the team?

Placement letters will be emailed in early April.

What will be in the placement letter?

Placement letters will include the team financial information for the team that your skater made, the club handbook, team contract, important dates and the practice schedule. Please note that we give a preliminary schedule, but dates and times are subject to change.
